Feel like you are on permanent holiday at home in this spectacular residence, designed and built by architect Dennis Silver to be his own home.

Selling agent Tonia McNeilly said the home was designed 40 years ago to capture garden views from all rooms. She said the first home open had mass interest, with more than 70 people visiting and inquiries from people from as far away as Sydney and the UK.

"It just goes to show that some homes are real show stoppers," she said. "The current owners have left the original bones of the home intact, enjoying Silver's vision of open-plan living and the

use of floor-to-ceiling windows that connect indoor and outdoor."

Japanese elements feature throughout the home, including a water feature with mature koi and water lilies, while custom-made laser-cut steel by the entrance hints at the home's retro influences.

In 2007, renowned architectural practice CODA designed award-winning alterations and additions for the home that included a private north-facing courtyard, a new designer kitchen with walk-in pantry and an extended balcony that overlooks the solar-heated pool.

Upstairs is a parents' wing while downstairs are three king-size children's bedrooms with a playroom.
